What is crypto gaming?

Crypto gaming allows players to make money while gaming, using blockchain technology.

A **cryptocurrency** is a **digital currency** run using a blockchain. It has value like any regular currency, but its **value can fluctuate dramatically.**

The **blockchain** keeps track of that currency's transactions. When a game is run on a blockchain, **users create tokens of cryptocurrency,** which they can 'cash out' into regular money.

Although the games have an age rating of 18+, all you need to start playing is a **cryptocurrency wallet.** Any child **aged 13+ can download a wallet,** but they will need **parental permission.** If your child has a wallet, be aware that they could sign up to play.

What are some examples?

Axie Infinity is currently the most popular crypto game. Players purchase three characters with cryptocurrency in order to start playing. Each character is an **NFT**, or non-fungible token. This means that it is a unique digital object, and is worth money based on its rarity.

After buying these characters, players engage in adventures, quests and battles, or breed new, rarer characters. Players win in-game tokens of the cryptocurrency **Ethereum**, which can be exchanged into GBP.

Other popular crypto games include **Splinterlands**, **Crypto Kitties and Gods Unchained**.

What are the risks?

Crypto gamers often have to **invest a lot of money to just start playing,** and there is **no guarantee** that you may be successful within the game. The **value of the cryptocurrency can also change dramatically,** which affects any earnings.

Children and young people could also feel **pressure to keep spending money** within the game, particularly if they are watching other streamers who may have spent lots.

There are many games emerging, as well as some that appear to be **scams**. If the game is run on a seemingly new cryptocurrency, it might be best to avoid it.

What else should I know?

Most blockchain games appear to be **designed** with children in mind; they use bright colours, fun characters and engaging gameplay. But the financial risk means that they aren't suitable for under-18s.

Make sure your child **feels comfortable** talking to you about **any problems or worries** they may have about this gaming trend.
