Worried about something your child is doing online?

Young people can be radicalised online in many ways, being drawn into forming extreme or harmful ideas. Autistic young people can be especially vulnerable.

Spotting signs of radicalisation

- Is your child using extreme language or phrases?
- Is your child focused on a new interest that concerns you?
- Is your child acting aggressively or becoming withdrawn?

Behavioural changes can be a sign that a loved one is heading down a path towards radicalisation. A Prevent referral can provide valuable support.
